Let Lent Lead



The theme for this Lenten season is *Let Lent Lead*. We'll explore how a season of reflection leads us to better understand the mystery of Easter. Plan to join us for Sunday worship, special services, and/or our new short-term groups. There are wonderful ways to grow your faith with Covenant Presbyterian Church this year.



SPECIAL SERVICES

The special services of Lent have not always been celebrated in the Presbyterian Church (USA). But more and more congregations are choosing to mark the season in this way. Often at night and with smaller crowds, we worship in a more creative and contemplative manner. While we often think of the penitence of Lent as a personal or inward matter, the special services remind us that we enter this journey as a community of faith. That we pray as one, confess as a community, and take the imposition of ashes in public. We realize that no one is alone on the journey.



Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22, 7:00 p.m.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season with the sacrament of communion and the imposition of ashes. The ashes remind us of our humanity and our need for repentance. Pastors make the sign of the cross on your forehead (or hand) with ashes from last year's Palm Sunday palms.(Thanks to Lisa and Brooke Taylor!) We wear the ashes collectively as well as individually. We gather in the sanctuary at 7:00 p.m.



Schubert's Mass, March 26, 11:00 a.m.

Dr. James Kohler and the Covenant Presbyterian Choir lead us in worship on the fifth Sunday of Lent. Moving away from the traditional order, this service will be seeped in song. Schubert's Mass in G Major is a narrative piece of music for chorus, solos, and instruments. We gather in the sanctuary at 11:00 a.m.



Maundy Thursday, April 6, 7:00 p.m.

Holy Week is the week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. It was named "Holy Week" because it was the church's week - a special time to remember Jesus's journey to the cross. The word Maundy comes from the latin, 'mandatum', or 'command' which refers to the instructions Jesus gave his disciples at the Last Supper. We'll begin with the celebration of the Lord's Supper, moving on to extinguish candles as we read about the last days of Jesus' life on earth. It is traditional to leave the service in silence. Plan to join us in the sanctuary at 7:00 p.m

The Lenten Season is a great time to get involved with faith formation. These short-term opportunities WILL help you grow in faith this season.




