This Lenten season, our focus will be on the power of listening. In a confusing world filled with distractions and demands, we often overlook the profound impact that listening has on our relationships, our lives, and our understanding of God. Through our Lenten sermon series, we will explore the possibilities of listening, both to one another and to the whispers of the Holy Spirit. Lenten Services

The special services of Lent have not always been celebrated in the Presbyterian Church (USA). But more and more congregations are choosing to mark the season in this way. Often at night and with smaller crowds, we worship in a more creative and contemplative manner. While we often think of the penitence of Lent as a personal or inward matter, the special services remind us that we enter this journey as a community of faith. That we pray as one, confess as a community, and take the

imposition of ashes in public.

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14, 7:00 p.m.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season with the sacrament of communion and the imposition of ashes. The ashes remind us of our humanity and our need for repentance. Pastors make the sign of the cross on your forehead (or hand) with ashes from last year's Palm Sunday palms. We wear the ashes collectively as well as individually. We gather in the sanctuary at 7:00 p.m. with a light supper beginning in the Fellowship Hall at 6:00 p.m.

Cantata, March 3, 11:00 a.m.

Dr. James Kohler and the Covenant Presbyterian Choir lead us in worship on the third Sunday of Lent. Moving away from the traditional order, this service will be seeped in song and present Louis Vierne's Messe solennelle (Solemn Mass), Op. 16. Vierne was organist and composer of Notre-Dame de Paris from 1900 until his death. It has been 5 years since Notre Dame Cathedral suffered a terrible fire. Vierne's work features all the colors of the mighty organ and choir.

Maundy Thursday, March 28, 6:00 p.m.

Holy Week is the week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. It was named "Holy Week" because it was the church's week - a special time to remember Jesus's journey to the cross. The word Maundy comes from the latin, *'mandatum'*, or'command' which refers to the instructions Jesus gave his disciples at the Last Supper. We'll gather in congregants' homes to celebrate the sacrament in an intimate setting.

Good Friday, March 29, 7:00 p.m.

We will join with Morningside and Central Presbyterian churches for our Good Friday service this year. Join us for this solemn gathering at Central, across from the Capitol Building.
